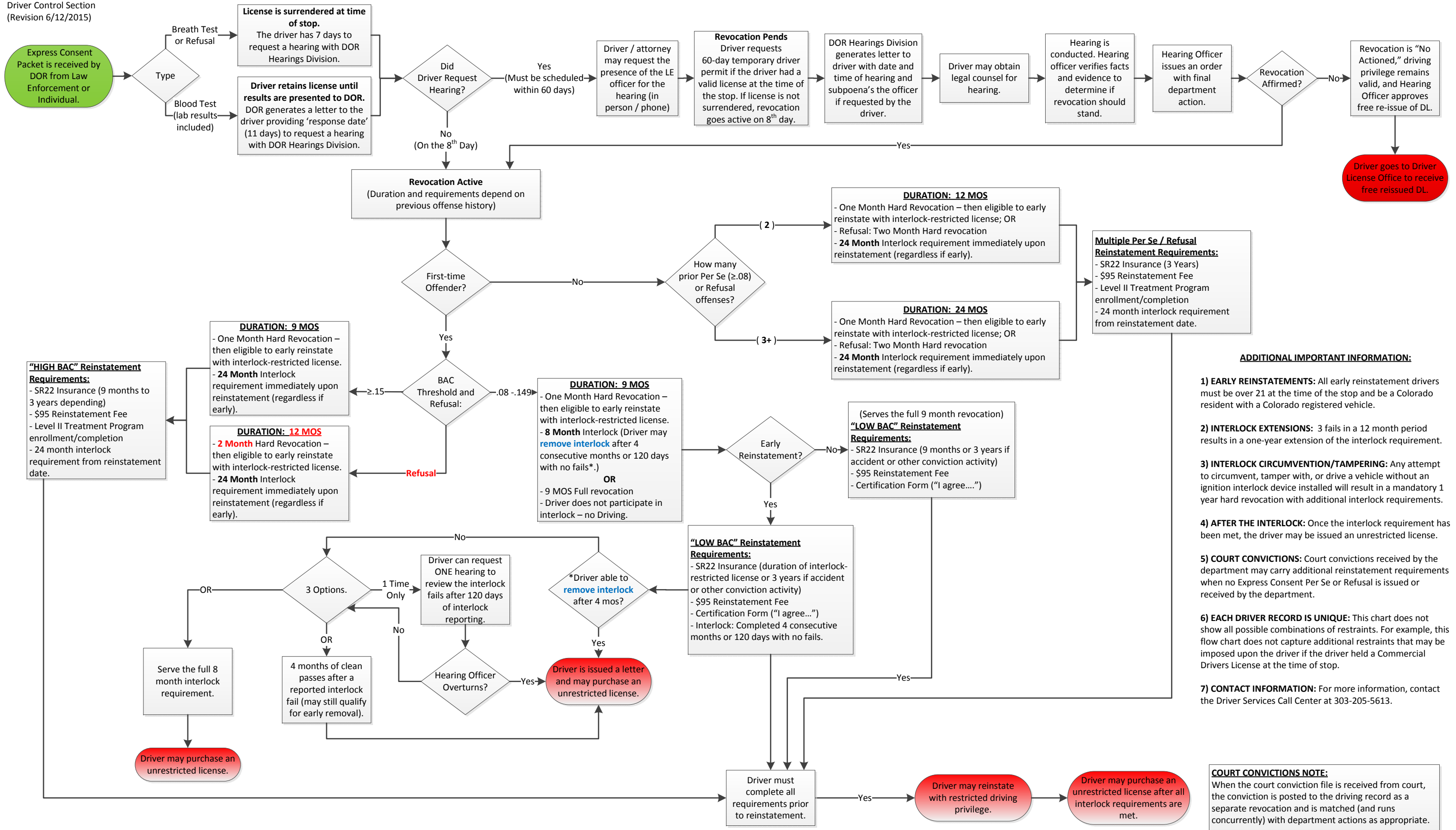


BASIC CASE LIFESPAN OF AN EXPRESS CONSENT PER SE OR REFUSAL



ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- 1) EARLY REINSTATEMENTS:** All early reinstatement drivers must be over 21 at the time of the stop and be a Colorado resident with a Colorado registered vehicle.
- 2) INTERLOCK EXTENSIONS:** 3 fails in a 12 month period results in a one-year extension of the interlock requirement.
- 3) INTERLOCK CIRCUMVENTION/TAMPERING:** Any attempt to circumvent, tamper with, or drive a vehicle without an ignition interlock device installed will result in a mandatory 1 year hard revocation with additional interlock requirements.
- 4) AFTER THE INTERLOCK:** Once the interlock requirement has been met, the driver may be issued an unrestricted license.
- 5) COURT CONVICTIONS:** Court convictions received by the department may carry additional reinstatement requirements when no Express Consent Per Se or Refusal is issued or received by the department.
- 6) EACH DRIVER RECORD IS UNIQUE:** This chart does not show all possible combinations of restraints. For example, this flow chart does not capture additional restraints that may be imposed upon the driver if the driver held a Commercial Drivers License at the time of stop.

COURT CONVICTIONS NOTE:
When the court conviction file is received from court, the conviction is posted to the driving record as a separate revocation and is matched (and runs concurrently) with department actions as appropriate.
