

Commercial Learner's Permit (CLP) Expiration Date is Changing

CLPs in Colorado will now be valid for one year



What you need to know to obtain a CLP in Colorado

- Be at least 18 years old.
- Possess a valid regular driver license.
- Visit a DMV office and successfully pass the knowledge tests required.
- Once exams have been successfully passed, purchase a CDL permit.
- Provide current DOT medical card.
- CLPs are not renewable. If you do not convert your CLP into a CDL before it expires, you will have to re-take all required exams.

IMPORTANT

- CLPs issued prior to the new policy rollout will not be eligible for renewal and the CLP process will need to be restarted including retaking any applicable exams and paying the fee for a new permit.
- You must hold your CLP for at least 14 days and complete the ELDT requirements for the class of CDL you want to obtain before a skills test can be scheduled.
- If you upgrade the CDL class or add an endorsement after obtaining a CLP, all knowledge tests will need to be retaken and you will be issued a new permit. Please take care to apply for the CLP that you need.
