State of Colorado Checklist: Rebuilt Title Established by Salvage Title

The following steps must be completed when repairs have been made to a salvage title vehicle to obtain a road worthy title. The title will be branded "Rebuilt from Salvage." Forms can be found online at DMV.Colorado.gov/forms-and-publications

Step	What You Need To Do	Forms/Fees
1	Apply for a Certificate of Title at the county motor vehicle office in the county in which you live. Secure and verifiable identification (SVID) is required to obtain a title or registration in the state of Colorado. (please see DR 2841 Secure and Verifiable ID for a list of acceptable documents). The county may request to see your receipts for major parts used in repair. Note: Taking title will disclose the mileage on the DR 2173 Motor Vehicle Bill of Sale. 2	Sign the statement on the face of the Salvage Title certifying that the vehicle is road worthy, pursuant to C.R.S. 42-4-201 through 42-4-234.	
3	The applicant shall stamp into the motor vehicle the words "REBUILT FROM SALVAGE", with each letter being not less than one-fourth inch in size. Such words should be stamped in the following locations: • Motorcycle — on the frame in a visible location. • Class A Motor Home — on the main entrance doorjamb. • Trailer — adjacent to the public vehicle identification number. • All other motor vehicles — on the body post to which the driver's door latches, also known as the driver's door B pillar.	
4	Have the vehicle inspected and the Colorado Certified VIN Inspection completed by a certified Colorado law enforcement officer or P.O.S.T certified inspector (Your local county motor vehicle office can refer you to a P.O.S.T certified inspector in your area). Complete DR 2424 Salvage Title Statement of Fact. The bottom portion must be complete by a certified inspector (Only invoices and/or receipts should be provided to inspector for review). Inspection must not be over one (1) year old https://csp.colorado.gov/services-we-provide/get-a-vin-inspection Some of the items the certified inspector will check are: Lights Tires and Wheels Mirrors Windshield and Wipers Sufficient horsepower to operate with the normal flow of traffic All parts must be permanently attached by welding, brackets or bolts Seat(s) permanently attached No torn or jagged metal "Rebuilt from Salvage" stamped on vehicle If an Assigned VIN is required by the certified inspector, follow the	DR 2704 (will be provided by P.O.S.T certified inspector) Inspection Fee – Refer to the CSP Inspection page for current pricing. DR 2424 Invoices, Bills of Sale and/or receipts for the parts used to make vehicle road worthy
